Notwithstanding many disadvantages of using electronic textbooks, there are also many advantages. For instance, electronic textbooks are very convenient. They have some functions that traditional textbooks don't have, such as listening to music, watching videos and checking new words in a dictionary. These can help students to study. The tablet can also help students to write faster by typing. Besides, electronic textbooks of all subjects can be put in a tablet. It can reduce the weight of the schoolbag that a student needs to carry. This can make students more comfortable and there will be more space in students' schoolbags to put other things.

Youth Crime

'Smoking is cool!' 'Drugs make me feel high!' 'There is bullying in our school every day.'

It is not difficult to hear the above remarks. Youth crime is no longer somewhat shocking news in Hong Kong. Some people would even just take a quick look when they find these sorts of reports on newspapers. Yet, this social phenomenon certainly deserves our great attention as the youth crime rate has been on the rise in recent years.

In the first place, it is necessary to find out the root of the issue. Personal emotion is a culprit in these cases. Some teenagers have no one to talk to about their problems. Others may not be willing to admit that they have doubts and fears. Even if there is someone to talk to, some teenagers might not discuss their problems because they are afraid that people will make fun of them. When they are unable to deal with their tension, committing crimes like smoking, drinking and taking drugs become the attractive and readily available escape from their real-life headaches.

Study pressure is also one big factor, if not the only, contributing to youth crime in Hong Kong. Doing well academically seems to be more important than balanced development in local communities. Local students thus have to do their best to climb up the academic ladder. Who can't withstand study pressure may quit school at early age and go on the path to juvenile delinquency.

Individualism and materialism are commonly cited as having harmful effects on young people's growth and development. Advertisements put pressure on people to be trendy. Electronic gadgets are one of the prime examples. Very often, young people are obsessed with materialism and may go astray in the end. Some may even commit crime to gratify their vanity, typical examples are drug trafficking and prostitution.

We can ascribe these youth crime problems to the lack of parents', schools' and social's emphasis. In order to prevent further harm, we have to tackle the problems accordingly. In family scale, parents should pay attention to their kids with sympathy and understanding as well as try to bridge the generation gap. Besides, making concession is also necessary. With a little encouragement from parents, young people will do better.



To a large extent, they could learn how to mingle with others, and polish inter-personal skills.

Having applied the mentioned rationales and initiatives, it seems reasonable to conclude that the problem of 'Hong Kong Kids' has become more severe, and therefore parents must take immediate actions before it is too late.

Deplorably, no law is set up so far on the grounds of the concerns over the curbing of press freedom. The government should contemplate this issue again and the implementation of law is indispensable. The government has to give first priority to the law about privacy in a bid to combat the problem. Otherwise, things can go worse and become difficult to counter as time goes by.
